There were **18** residential burglaries during the month of October, with **0** occurring at an active Block Watch residence.


Every year I compile crime analysis reports involving different types of crimes occurring in Renton. The residential burglary report has consistently shown that over 80 percent of all residential burglaries occur in non-Block Watch neighborhoods.

An active Block Watch neighborhood is one that holds a meeting at least once a year with a Crime Prevention Coordinator. You schedule this by contacting me and arranging a time, date, and location for the hour-long meeting. I will make as many meeting announcements as you need and once you receive the flyers, you hand them out to whomever you would like to attend. The Block Watch meeting gives everybody an opportunity to meet their neighbors and learn what they can do to better protect their home, family, and neighborhood.



There is a lot of information that is not known by citizens in regards to property crimes and their patterns. Did you know that a large number of residential burglaries are non-force entry? Did you know that the majority of residential burglaries happen during the daytime? Did you know that most criminals who target your home do so for specific reasons? Do you know what those reasons are? Did you know that criminals who conduct residential burglaries are commonly on foot and take portable items such as cameras, cash, jewelry, cell phones, et cetera

Take time to consider whether or not you want to be proactive in protecting your neighborhood. Many times I receive meeting requests from citizens because they have been victimized by criminal activity in their neighborhood. A Block Watch meeting may have served them better if they had considered one before they were targeted.



I understand that having a Block Watch meeting is no guarantee you won't be victimized by crime - but it couldn't hurt, could it?
