Spring is here; for many of us, that means spring cleaning.

Our Sustainability and Waste Management Division and Renton Police Department have several upcoming events to help Renton residents dispose of or recycle unwanted items.

April 15 – Shred-a-thon & Prescription Drug Takeback, 9 a.m.-12 p.m., Renton Memorial Stadium (405 Logan Ave N, 98057). Shred those unwanted documents and turn in unused or expired prescription drugs during Renton PD's annual drive-through event. Officers and staff will unload your vehicle and accept nonperishable food items for donation to local food banks. All items should be placed in your trunk, hatchback, or truck bed.

May 13 – Metal and Styrofoam Recycle Event, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., Renton Technical College North Parking Lot (NE 6th Place & Monroe Avenue NE, 98056). The first of three recycling events from our Sustainability and Waste Management Division.

Shift Green – Many of the city's auto parts stores take back used motor oil and filters at no cost. The oil collected by these stores is recycled into re-refined oil or burned as bunker fuel, giving your used oil a second life.

Curbside Recycling - When preparing your curbside recyclables, please empty, clean, and dry them before placing them loosely in your cart. Do not place recyclables in garbage totes or plastic bags. Extra recyclables should be placed in containers next to your curbside cart. Our website lists recycling resources for those items that cannot go in your blue recycle cart.

# Rainier Ave Phase 4 to include nighttime work

Work on <u>Phase 4 of the Rainier Avenue S Improvement</u> <u>Project</u> will include nighttime work starting as early as the week of April 3. The project includes improvements between S 3rd Street and NW 3rd Place. Adding a night shift will help ensure the safety of workers and the traveling public, especially for work taking place near active travel lanes.

Some temporary driveway impacts are expected for properties in the project area. However, the project's outreach team will provide advanced notice to tenants before any impacts occur and will work with individual businesses and residents to create access plans. In addition, crews will always work to minimize impacts. Please drive slowly and safely through the work zone.



# **CERT disaster prep classes start on April 20**

Our <u>Emergency Management Division</u> can help your disaster preparedness through their free CERT (Community Emergency Preparedness Team) class. They will cover personal preparedness, first aid, fire suppression, search and rescue, and team organization through classroom and hands-on training.

Classes are on Thursdays from April 20 to June 3, from 6-9 p.m. at Renton Regional Fire Authority Station 14 (1900 Lind Ave SW 98057). A final drill is Saturday, June 3, from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. <u>Register online</u> using the keyword CERT. Ages 18 and up.



# Neighborhood Program resources forum

Our <u>Neighborhood Programs Division</u> held its initial Neighborhood Forum last Saturday.

The forum showcased and explained available city resources. Attendees spent most of the meeting in small groups talking with representatives from nine city divisions: city attorney, community & economic development, equity, housing, and human services, executive services, parks and recreations, police, and public works. They also heard from Mayor Armondo Pavone on establishing effective two-way communications between the city and residents.

#### Washington Hospitality Grant

This grant is <u>available to restaurants</u>, <u>bars</u>, food trucks, <u>caterers</u>, <u>hotels</u>, <u>wineries</u>, <u>and similar businesses</u>. The application deadline is April 6.

### Black Founder Startup Grant

SoGal Foundation has teamed up with Winky Lux, Blue mercury, TwelveNYC, Walmart org's Center for Racial Equity, and other sponsors to make a small step towards progress by <u>providing \$10K and \$5K cash</u> grants to Black women or nonbinary entrepreneurs.
