# Fourth of July reminders

We wish our residents and visitors a safe and fun celebration as Independence Day nears. Here are a few reminders for the upcoming holiday:

- On Tuesday, July 4, all city facilities will be closed.
- Due to construction projects at Gene Coulon Memorial Beach Park, the city will not host their annual Fourth of July firework show.
- Amenities at Coulon Park and Kennydale Beach Park are available throughout the day. Picnic shelters at Coulon Park are open on a first-come, first-served basis.
- The sale and discharge of fireworks are prohibited within Renton city limits and throughout King County. No Committee of the Whole or City Council
- Meeting on Monday, July 3. Renton Farmers Market will be closed Tuesday, July
- 4. The next market will be Tuesday, July 11, from 3-7 p.m., and will feature a musical performance by Gianni Aiello.
- Volunteers are needed for post-Fourth of July celebration clean-ups at Gene Coulon Memorial Beach Park or Cedar River Park & Liberty Park on Litter pick up on Wednesday, July 5

A message from Police Chief Jon Schuldt: Fourth of July

With the 4th of July quickly approaching, and if history serves as any indicator, we can expect some of our community members celebrating our country's independence to do so by lighting fireworks. In 2005, Renton residents voted to ban fireworks within the city fireworks. Those that choose to violate the law and

limits. Most of King County has similar bans on the use of interfere with the peace of their neighbors do so at the risk of potential civil and criminal violations. Every year, we hear and understand the frustrations from

the community regarding those who choose to violate the

law. We empathize with the quality of life disruption. Effective public safety is a partnership between the

community and those sworn to protect it. From an enforcement standpoint, we won't be able to hold every violator responsible, but what increases that probability is accurate information relayed to our officers. If reporting sounds of fireworks without a direction or a location, the probability of an officer locating it is virtually zero. In most cases, an officer must witness the fireworks being lit or be in possession of a person to take enforcement.

We dispatch police calls by priority or severity, so we ask for your patience and understanding as we respond to the high volume of calls we receive regarding fireworks. Depending on the calls for service that are being received and the availability of an officer, they may not be dispatched immediately. To report fireworks violations, please call our non-emergency line at 425-235-2121.
