

This limited-time offer is available on a first-come, firstserved basis and is valid from April 20, 2023, to September 30, 2023 (dates subject to change).

Main Street Money provides an incentive to visit and encourages participants to support local businesses and contribute to community growth. Explore the diverse range of participating businesses and experience all Renton's downtown district offers.

The program is a partnership with the Washington State Main Street Program, Renton Downtown Partnership, and the city's Community Economic and Development Department.

Solera is a crucial part of the Sunset Area Redevelopment Plan and a significant investment in the community. Once complete, the project will provide 686 new residential units, including affordable housing, market-rate units, townhome ownership, 5,800 square feet of commercial real estate, 9,000 square feet of childcare, and over 1,000 new parking stalls. Located along Sunset Blvd. NE between NE 100th St. and

Phases II and III of the Bronson Way Bridge seismic retrofit

and deck maintenance project will be completed today (July 12), and the bridge will reopen this afternoon. These seismic improvements to the bridge were crucial for the safety of drivers and hadn't been performed since 1939.

During the closure, crews completed a seismic retrofit to the steel main span. In addition, they installed new elastomeric bearing pads and compression seal expansion joints. The roadway received a waterproofing membrane.

replacement dates WSDOT will begin work later this summer repairing the


Lind Avenue SW bridge after being damaged in June 2022 by a truck pulling a backhoe. Closed since then, this project will restore the structural integrity of the bridge. During this project, slated for completion in winter 2024,

the entire north span and part of the south span of the bridge will be replaced.
