WSDOT has started preparations for the bridge

replacement project on the I-405 Lind Avenue overpass.

**Avenue Bridge repairs** 

Starting Friday, November 3, at 11 p.m. through Monday, November 6, until 4:30 a.m., southbound I-405 will close 24 hours a day so crews can demolish the damaged section of the bridge. The detour is via Talbot Road and Grady Way.

Once this portion of the project is complete, there will be one final full closure to place girders for the new overpass, and lane reductions will reduce the effects on people who rely on I-405.

The bridge has been closed since it was damaged in June 2022 by a truck pulling a backhoe. The repairs will include the replacement of the entire north span and a portion of the south span, and will be complete in winter 2024.
