After a successful pilot, Renton's Shift Green Program continues in the new year. Shift Green originated in 2021 to offer residents a way to recycle used oil filters and motor oil for free at AutoZone and O'Reilly stores in Renton.

The program exceeded expectations, showcasing the community's commitment to a greener future.

The program focused on supporting the collection of used motor oil and oil filters from Do-It-Yourself (DIY) oil changes while encouraging vehicle owners, in collaboration with local auto parts stores, to address fluid leaks that pollute local waterways.

The program achieved an impressive recycling rate that surpassed the city's annual DIY oil output. Participating auto parts stores in Renton have played a crucial role not only in collecting an estimated 38,299 gallons of used DIY oil between 2021 and 2022 but also in fostering awareness around identifying and fixing vehicle leaks that pollute our local waterways.

Whether done from home or at a dealership, we can all be part of the solution toward a cleaner and greener Renton. Learn more about the program and find the nearest dropoff location. If a mechanic or dealership does the oil change, ask how they recycle oil filters.



stay warm

The upcoming weather forecast calls for below-freezing temperatures and possible snow and ice starting Thursday evening. The well-being and safety of residents during extreme weather conditions are our utmost priority. Rest assured, the city and local organizations have implemented measures to keep the community informed and provide essential resources.

City Website and Social Media: The <u>city's website</u> and <u>social media platforms</u> will regularly update the latest news on weather-related service changes and resources. Check the city's website and follow their social media accounts for real-time information.

Streets and Road Condition Maintenance: In a snowstorm, plows will work four staggered 12-hour shifts to keep plows on the roads 24 hours a day. Primary and secondary arterials will be prioritized before

neighborhoods. Trucks are assigned to a specific location in the city and follow a <u>priority mapping system</u> for that area.

Daytime Warming Centers: Renton Community Center (1715 Maple Valley Hwy), Renton Library (100 Mill Ave S), and Renton Highlands Library (2801 NE 10th St) will be available as daytime warming centers. Hours of operations

Williams Ave S Streetscapes Project halfway to completion

As part of the latest downtown streetscapes project, the 200 block of Williams Avenue South (between 2nd and 3rd) has reached the halfway mark toward completion. Construction began in October 2023 and thus far has completed the following efforts:

- Demolition and removal of existing sidewalk, curb, street trees, and some streetlights on the west side
- Relocation of six existing street trees to selected downtown locations Installation of new streetlight electrical and
- irrigation infrastructure, curb, and sidewalks Opening the new sidewalk to the public
- Demolition of sidewalks, streetlight foundations,
- and driveways on the east side in preparation for installation of electrical and irrigation conduits and storm drainage downspout pipe

The project is currently focusing on the east side portion,

- curb, sidewalk, and tree grates Installation of streetlights and irrigation conduits
 - Pouring concrete for streetlight bases and curb Landscaping and tree replanting on the west side
- of the block The west side sidewalk and parking lane have reopened.

Still, portions of the west sidewalk will have cones, barricades, and temporary covers for future tree grates, planter areas, and utility boxes for safety purposes.

The City of Renton started improving the streets and sidewalks of downtown blocks in 2017 in conjunction with several key initiatives. These public rights-of-way improvements, collectively known as "streetscapes," help improve the appearance and safety of sidewalk and street areas and provide a more vibrant pedestrian experience. Over the past several years, several street intersection projects have installed streetscape improvements, including 2nd, 3rd, and Houser and Main and along the 200 block of Wells and Williams.
