Join a Board, Committee, or Commission

The City of Renton greatly values input and collaboration from residents on expanding projects, plans, and policies. There are several ways for community members to participate in the civic process, from signing up to make a public comment during a council meeting or volunteering. One even larger way to become part of the civic process is by joining one of the city's boards, commissions, or committees.

Renton has several active boards, commissions, and committees that serve in different capacities to support the mayor, councilmembers, and city staff in making decisions in specialized areas of interest.

Currently, there are several openings:

Armondo Pavone designated April 8 Sexual Assault Awareness Month in Renton. To accept the proclamation was the newly appointed CEO of King County Sexual Assault Resource Center (KCSARC), Kate Kurg.

During Monday night's council meeting, Mayor

KCSARC is a non-profit located in Renton and has been serving the communities of Renton and King County

since 1976.

"Half of women and one-third of men have experienced sexual assault in their lifetime. The trauma of sexual assault is something that can affect a survivor's mental, physical, and behavioral health, but recovery from the trauma of sexual assault is possible with support," stated KSCARC CEO Kate Kurg.

In 2023, KSCARC assisted more than 4,800 individuals and their families. The organization offers free and confidential support for survivors and their families, whether it be therapy, resource lines, legal advocacy, or family support.
