Willowcrest wins Governor's Smart Communities **Award**

The Willowcrest Townhomes project in the Sunset neighborhood has been awarded a Governor's Smart **Communities Award** by the Washington State Department of Commerce. The award was presented during Monday's city council meeting.

Willowcrest is the first permanently affordable multifamily homeownership project in King County that features netzero energy construction. Each of its 12 units has heating and cooling systems that provide a 25% energy savings beyond the state's energy code. A high-efficiency heat pump water heater also reduces energy costs, and WaterSense low-flow fixtures provide water conservation. In addition, the homes provide permanent affordable housing for families making between 60 and 80% of the area median The innovative project is a partnership between Homestead

Community Land Trust (sponsor and developer), Renton Housing Authority (land donation), JP Morgan Chase (initial grant contribution), and the City of Renton (grant contribution).

In last week's TWIR, we highlighted our Public Works Department Street Maintenance crew's work to prepare for

winter weather.

- Our Emergency Management Division has winter prep tips for your home and vehicle this week. At home:
- Prepare an <u>emergency kit</u> with non-perishable food, water, flashlight, extra batteries, medical supplies, extra clothes, and blankets.

 If your power is out, dress in layers and stay dry to stay warm. Call your utility to report the outage. Puget Sound **Energy** and **Seattle City Light** have additional information on getting through a power outage. For food safety, avoid opening your refrigerator door unless necessary.

- If using a portable generator, keep it outdoors and at least 20 feet from windows, doors, or vents. Due to carbon monoxide poisoning risk, do not use a gas stove, oven, or a gas or charcoal barbeque to heat your home—generator safety tips from Puget Sound Energy.
- To get the most current emergency instructions for your area, sign up for ALERT Renton.

Driving in the snow: • Stay home. Only go out if necessary.

- Drive slowly; accelerate and decelerate slowly.
- Increase your following distance to five to six seconds.
- Don't stop if you can avoid it.
- Don't accelerate or stop when going up hills.
- If you become stuck, do not abandon your car.
- In your vehicle, you should have:

Blankets, mittens, socks, and hats. Ice scraper and snow brush.

- Flashlight, plus extra batteries (or a hand-crank
- flashlight).
- Jumper cables. • First-aid kit (band-aids, adhesive tape, antiseptic wipes,

gauze pads, antiseptic cream, medical wrap).

- Bottled water.
