Our 2023-2024 budget contains \$812,000 in human services funding for residents. This increased funding was approved by the city council and will be used by local and regional providers to assist members of our community.

The Human Services Division coordinated the application process and executed the distribution of funds. The division is within the city's newest department, Equity, Housing, and Human Services (EHHS). EHHS was formed to unite divisions dedicated to improving residents' health and livability by funding resources and streamlining providers' application and distribution processes.

We received applications from 91 providers for this funding cycle. The Human Services Advisory Committee spent months thoroughly reviewing applications and <u>recommended funding for 64 human</u> services providers. For the convenience and to reduce multiple applications, providers submitted applications using the Human Services Funding Collaborative, a collection of 16 cities in King County. The collaborative's application process allowed providers to enter their information once and have it sent to each member city. Joining Renton in the collaborative were the cities of Auburn, Bellevue, Burien, Covington, Des Moines, Federal Way, Issaquah, Kenmore, Kent, Kirkland, Redmond, Sammamish, SeaTac, Shoreline, and Tukwila.

The applications were placed into six priority areas: Basic Needs, Connector Services, Domestic Violence/Sexual Assault Services, Economic Opportunity/Self Sufficiency, Health and Wellness, and Homeless/Housing Services for review. The advisory committee used a 15-point matrix incorporating priority and equity as part of the review process.

Once an application is executed with a service provider, quarterly reporting is required to track and ensure Renton community members receive services. Data collected from 2021-2022 indicated primarily women and children served. The reporting also includes narratives that provide a view into the impact of the services. These stories are both powerful and impactful.

Entrepreneur Workshop & Pitch Competition

Do you own a business in downtown Renton?

Have you thought about opening a business downtown?

If your answer is "yes" to either question, Renton Downtown Partnership, in partnership with the city, OneEastside, Port of Seattle, and Renton Chamber of Commerce, gives existing business owners and entrepreneurs a chance to share their ideas through a free Entrepreneur Workshop & Pitch Competition. Winners in each of the three categories will receive \$5,000. In addition, \$5,000 incentive bonuses will be given to the first three finalists who sign a lease for a downtown storefront by Oct. 15, 2023.

The pitch competition includes four in-person workshops at the downtown Renton Library (100 Mill Ave. S) from 6-8 p.m.

April 11: Pitch Preparation Drop-in Session

The finale will be a live pitch event at Renton Civic Theatre (507 S. 3rd St.) on April 18.

The workshops explain the ins and outs of launching a small business, including choosing a business structure, government regulations, business insurance, a summary business plan, small business financing and accounting, marketing, branding, perfecting your pitch, and more.

The three competition categories include:

- **Startup/Idea:** Businesses will have no sales or revenues. Contestants must attend 3 of the 4 workshops to be eligible to win an award: Competition Kickoff, Marketing ++, and either Business Plan Basics or Financial Planning.
- Early: Any business with less than \$75,000 of gross sales last year or less than two years in business. Contestants must attend the Kickoff and Marketing++ workshops to be eligible to win an award. Attendance at other workshops is optional.
- Established: Any business with more than \$75,000 in gross sales last year or in business for more than two years. Contestants must attend the Competition Kickoff and Marketing ++ workshops in person to be eligible to win an award. Attendance at other workshops is optional.
